



## Resources for Pediatric Cancer Families

### **Cancer-Specific Resources by Category**

#### **Activities**

- **Candlelighters for Children with Cancer**  
Hosts family and teen activities virtually and throughout Oregon and SW Washington.
- **A Kid Again**  
Provides year-round, cost-free events to help bring smiles to the faces of kids with life-threatening conditions, their siblings, and their parents.
- **American Childhood Cancer Organization**  
Offers free resources and activities that can be shipped to families, as well as online resources and support.
- **Chelsea Hicks Foundation**  
Provides a rolling dress-up closet and monthly dress-up parties for seriously ill children in Doernbecher and Randall.
- **Children's Cancer Association**  
A website where children can find joy through music by listening to music, taking virtual music lessons, and playing music-themed games.
- **CHAP: Children's Healing Art Project**  
Programs include hospital programs that provide free art activities for hospitalized

children, as well as Art Club programs offered in person in the studio and via Zoom.

- **ClubNEGU**

Provides Joy Jars, plush buddies, gift boxes, and care cards to children diagnosed with cancer and their family members.

- **Embrace Compassion**

Offers a fun farm experience in Sherwood, OR for children in treatment and their siblings.

- **Kids & Art**

Uses the power of the arts and creativity to mitigate stress, anxiety, and trauma induced from diagnosis and treatment of pediatric cancer by providing art kits, online art workshops, and a weekly drop-in art room via Zoom.

- **The Light Collective**

Provides online interactive experiences and connection for the whole family through their Matchbox program.

- **LtP Foundation**

Offers events, birthday parties, and experiences for kids and families facing pediatric cancer.

- **Pile of Puppies**

Brings joy to chronically and terminally ill children and their families by surrounding them with a pile of puppies.

- **Well Beings Studio**

Art-based resources, experiences, and activities to open communication and support emotional well-being in families impacted by cancer, including stories, music, poetry, art workshops, podcasts, meditation, and more.

## **Aftercare / Survivorship**

- **Doernbecher Cancer Survivorship Program**

Provides multidisciplinary, holistic support to survivors of childhood cancer.

- **Legacy Health KITE Clinic**

Provides personalized services addressing physical, mental, and emotional health to help childhood cancer survivors and their families thrive.

- **Leukemia & Lymphoma Society**

Offers a survivorship workbook with care plan worksheets, long-term and late effects information, healthy behavior recommendations, mental health exercises and information, and resources for planning for the future. Also lists additional resources for survivorship.

- **National Cancer Institute**

Offers insight into care for childhood cancer survivors, including follow-up care, long-term and late effects, and questions to ask your child's cancer treatment team.

- **The National Children's Cancer Society**

Prepares survivors and their families for life after cancer, including information on treatment late effects, survivorship conferences, and college scholarships.

- **Together**

Provides resources for life after pediatric cancer, including information on survivorship care plans and personal health advocacy, long-term and late effects, healthy living, school and work, emotional well-being, and other post-treatment topics.

## **Camps**

- **Candlelighters Family Camp**

An annual three-day camp, free of charge, for families facing pediatric.

- **Camp Agape Portland**

A free, week-long family residential camp for cancer-afflicted children (ages 1–17) and their families.

- **Camp Goodtimes**

A week-long summer camp for eligible children in Washington (ages 8–17) who are or have been personally impacted by pediatric cancer.

- **Camp Millennium**

A free, week-long summer camp for children ages 5–16 dealing with a cancer diagnosis.

- **UKANDU**

Programs include Camp UKANDU (a week-long camp for children with cancer), UKANDU Teen Retreat (a weekend retreat for teens), UKANDU Family Camp (a program for the whole family), UKANDU Corps (a volunteer program for ages 12–16 that brings together youth with cancer and youth without cancer), and UKANDU Family Reunion (a one-day event for families who have previously attended UKANDU programs).

## Disease-Specific

- **Band of Parents**

Support network for families of children diagnosed with neuroblastoma.

- **Brain Tumor Network**

Offers pediatric navigation services dedicated to meeting you and your child's needs through education, support, and empowerment for you to participate in shared decision-making with your child's care team.

- **Children's Brain Tumor Foundation**

Support programs, art programs, bereavement support, treatment information, scholarships, events, and other resources for families battling pediatric brain tumors.

- **Children's Neuroblastoma Cancer Foundation**

Information and resources about neuroblastoma, from newly diagnosed and in-treatment to post-treatment.

- **Cure ATRT Now**

Information and resources for atypical teratoid rhabdoid tumors.

- **The Hepatoblastoma Resource Network**

A consolidated resource for families dealing with hepatoblastoma, including information on treatment, hospital resources, financial and family support, and other hepatoblastoma foundations.

- **Leukemia & Lymphoma Society**

Resources include information specialists available for one-on-one conversations, an online community, online chats, peer-to-peer support, a podcast, one-on-one nutrition consultations, support groups, financial support, a suggested reading list, and more.

- **Levi's Legacy DIPG Foundation**

Provides support for children diagnosed with diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma or other brain tumors and their families through financial assistance and goodie bags.

- **Northwest Sarcoma Foundation**

Provides financial assistance, online peer support groups, and care packages for sarcoma patients.

Resources include virtual support groups, toolkits for newly diagnosed families, digital care packages, peer-to-peer mentoring, animated short films to explain cancer topics to kids, information on clinical trials, and more.

## **Financial Assistance**

- **Candlelighters for Children with Cancer**

Provides emergency financial assistance to families with children currently in treatment, holiday gift sponsorship programs, and college scholarships for young adults who have been diagnosed with cancer.

- **Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation for Childhood Cancer**

Offers funding for transportation and lodging for eligible families who are financially burdened by traveling away from their home hospital for care that is only available elsewhere.

- **Arms Wide Open**

Provides monthly grants to families suffering hardship due to their child's cancer diagnosis.

- **The B+ Foundation**

Offers a family assistance program to provide money to qualified families for expenses that are attributed to their child's cancer diagnosis.

- **Battle for a Cure Foundation**

Offers gift cards to families to help with Christmas expenses, as well as Hope Boxes for children in hospice care.

- **CancerCare Co-Payment Assistance Foundation**

Helps those battling cancer overcome financial access and treatment barriers by assisting with co-payments for prescribed treatments of certain diagnoses.
- **Cancer Financial Assistance Coalition**

A coalition of organizations helping cancer patients manage their financial challenges. CFAC provides a searchable database of financial resources.
- **CAN Cancer: Community Assistance for Neighbors with Cancer**

Helps with non-medical living expenses for residents of Central Oregon, Harney County, Lincoln County, or Willamette Valley.
- **Children's Leukemia Research Association**

Offers a patient aid program as a co-pay assistance program for reimbursement of certain leukemia/blood cancer-related medical bills.
- **Darian's Gift**

Provides financial assistance for families in the Salem area going through pediatric cancer treatment.
- **Endure to Cure**

Offers a travel assistance program to help families with travel costs associated with their child's cancer treatment.
- **Ethan Jostad Foundation for Childhood Cancer**

Helps families in Oregon who are facing childhood cancer and in need of financial and family assistance.
- **Family Reach**

Offers support services to help families overcome the financial side effects of a cancer diagnosis, providing financial education, resource navigation, financial coaching, and emergency relief.

- **Final Farewell**

Helps families provide an affordable funeral for a loved child. Offers advice and guidance in addition to financial assistance.
- **HealthWell Foundation**

Offers help with co-pays, premiums, deductibles, and out-of-pocket expenses for supplies, supplements, surgeries, and more for specific diseases.
- **Kyla McCullough Gift Fund**

Provides direct financial support, via grants, to families of children living with cancer.
- **Leukemia & Lymphoma Society**

Offers various financial aid and assistance programs to help individuals with blood cancer, including an urgent need program and assistance with prescription drug costs.

Offers a family financial assistance program to help with special trips or wishes, paying bills, providing meals, and more.

Gives financial aid to families, via grants, to cover medical bills, supplement lost wages from treatment-related work disruptions, or be used however the family sees fit.

Provides financial assistance through a transportation assistance fund and an emergency assistance fund for families who have a child with cancer.

Provides compassionate and immediate financial support to children, teens, and their families undergoing cancer treatment and bone marrow transplantation at Doernbecher



Children's Hospital.

- **Northwest Sarcoma Foundation**

Provides grants to pediatric sarcoma patients currently undergoing treatment in Oregon and Washington.

- **The Pediatric Foundation**

Provides direct financial support to Central Oregon families who have a child with cancer and must travel long distances to receive treatments.

- **Pinky Swear Foundation**

Provides financial support to ease the financial impact of cancer, including help with rent and mortgages, car payments and insurance, groceries, gas, and more.

- **Sparrow Clubs**

Sponsors families of children diagnosed with a serious medical condition, to provide financial and emotional support.

- **Team Campbell Foundation**

Offers an assistance program to provide enrichment opportunities for a family facing childhood cancer—such as a family outing or special event—or to help relieve some of the financial burden associated with treatment.

- **United Healthcare Children's Foundation**

Offers medical grants for families who meet eligibility requirements.

Provides financial assistance to cancer patients and their families living in Lincoln, Tillamook, and Yamhill counties.

## Lodging

Offers a travel program that includes funding for transportation and lodging for eligible families who are financially burdened by traveling away from their home hospital for care that is only available elsewhere.

- **American Cancer Society**

Offers more than 30 Hope Lodge locations throughout the United States to provide cancer patients and their caregivers a free place to stay when their best hope for effective treatment may be in another city.

- **Joe's House**

A nonprofit organization that helps cancer patients and their families find a place to stay when traveling away from home for medical treatment.

- **Leukemia & Lymphoma Society**

Offers a travel assistance program to blood cancer patients with significant financial need to cover the cost of treatment-related travel and lodging expenses for the patient and caregiver.

- **The National Children's Cancer Society**

Offers a transportation assistance fund to alleviate the financial burden of travel and lodging for families who have a child with cancer. Includes expenses for lodging when a child needs to stay near the hospital for treatment and nonprofit lodging is unavailable.

- **The Pediatric Foundation**

Offers assistance with lodging for Central Oregon families, including discounted rates at hotels and help with lodging reservations.

- **Ronald McDonald House Charities of Oregon & SW Washington**

Lodging and food for families of children being treated at a hospital more than 30 miles from their home.

## **Mentorship**

- **Children's Cancer Association**

Trained, adult volunteer mentors provide emotional support to young patients in treatment and critical support to parents who endure the hardship of long hospital stays with their children.

- **CoHeals**

A free app for connecting and building relationships among families impacted by childhood cancer.

- **Connecting Champions**

A nonprofit organization that asks kids and young adults with cancer, “What are you passionate about?” and then connects them with a local mentor for the cancer journey.

- **The National Children’s Cancer Society**

Offers a mentoring program that pairs a younger child in treatment (ages 10–17) with one of their scholarship recipients. Mentors will offer their support and time to encourage their mentee as they face the challenges of childhood cancer, acting as a knowledgeable and experienced guide, trusted ally, and caring role model.

- **Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation**

Matches parents, caregivers, teens, and young adults with trained mentors who have experienced the challenges of a childhood brain tumor diagnosis. Mentors provide emotional support, suggest informational sources, and serve as an example of someone who has been on a similar journey.

- **Walk with Sally**

Matches children ages 7–17 who have been impacted by a loved one’s cancer with an adult who’s had a similar experience.

## **Newly Diagnosed**

- **Children’s Oncology Group**

A guide for the family of a newly diagnosis patient that includes information about cancer and treatment, when to call for help, visiting the emergency room, fever, managing symptoms, preventing infections, precautions during treatment, and giving medicines. Order a workbook (or read chapters online) written specifically for parents and

For eligible families in Washington, this three-day weekend retreat provides an opportunity to build connection in a fun and meaningful way.

- **Rett's Roost**

Hosts online retreats for families that have battled pediatric cancer, including a Peace Post-Treatment Retreat and a Grief is Love Bereavement Retreat.

## Scholarships

- **Candlelighters For Children With Cancer**

Annual scholarships awarded to high school seniors or current college students who have previously been or are currently diagnosed with cancer and reside in Oregon or SW Washington, to support their pursuit of a higher education.

- **Cancer for College**

Grants need-based scholarships and educational experiences to cancer survivors or cancer warriors who are enrolled in an accredited college or trade school, with a family income of less than \$150,000/year.

- **Children's Cancer Cause**

Awards academic scholarships to childhood cancer survivors who demonstrate a commitment to cancer advocacy.

- **The Izzy Foundation**

Offers academic scholarships to children nationwide who have been diagnosed with or treated for pediatric cancer, and their siblings. Scholarships are offered through both a K-12 category and a college category.

- **The National Children's Cancer Society**

Awards scholarships each academic year to childhood cancer survivors under the age of 25 who were diagnosed before the age of 18 and are attending or accepted into a post-secondary school in the U.S. for the upcoming academic year.

- **National Collegiate Cancer Foundation**

Offers \$1,000 competitive awards to cancer survivors or current patients ages 18–35 who are attending or planning to attend an accredited institution.

- **Ortlieb Foundation**

Supports current and former cancer patients in achieving their academic and career pursuits with biannual scholarships for eligible applicants.

- **Patient Advocate Foundation**

Provides support to individuals who are legal residents of the U.S. and pursuing undergraduate or graduate studies, who have been diagnosed with or treated for a cancer or chronic disease.

Provides support to siblings of children with cancer through SuperSibs, a mailing program dedicated to providing age-appropriate resources that offer coping skills, comfort, encouragement, and empowerment to siblings during their family's battle against childhood cancer.

## Transportation Assistance

- **Air Care Alliance**

Nationwide organization comprised of a network of volunteer pilot groups helping patients access free air transportation for distant medical care or supportive services.

- **Air Charity Network**

Provides access for people in need who are seeking free air transportation to specialized healthcare facilities.

- **Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation for Childhood Cancer**

Offers a travel program to ensure children battling childhood cancer have the financial assistance needed to travel to clinical trials, experimental therapeutics, or treatment innovations not currently available at their local institution.

- **Angel Flight West**

Helps arrange donated flights for people in need, providing them with safe passage to and from medical care. On the ground, Earth Angels drive passengers from the airport to the medical facility, also free of cost.

- **Compass to Care**

Covers travel expenses across several categories for families who meet the eligibility criteria.

- **Corporate Angel Network**

Helps cancer patients access the best treatment by arranging free travel on corporate aircraft. Participation is open to all cancer patients, as often as necessary, with no financial requirement.

Offers a travel assistance program to blood cancer patients with significant financial need to cover the cost of treatment-related travel and lodging expenses for the patient and caregiver.

- **Mercy Medical Angels**

Removes the barrier to medical care with transportation on the ground and in the air for patients with financial need.

- **Miracle Flights**

Offers free flights to those in need of life-changing medical care not available in their local communities by providing commercial plane tickets to all U.S.-based medical treatment facilities at no cost to families.

Offers a transportation assistance fund to alleviate the financial burden of travel and lodging for families who have a child with cancer. Includes transportation expenses such as mileage, airfare, and lodging when a child needs to stay near the hospital for treatment and nonprofit lodging is unavailable.

Free medical flights for people who need access to medical care that may be too far to get to by car.

## **Wigs and Hats**

- **Angel Hair Foundation**

Gives kids in Oregon who have lost hair due to medical illness or treatment an Angel Hair System for free. Angel Hair Systems are not wigs, but medical prosthetics attached to the head with medical adhesive, allowing children to play, sleep, and swim without worrying about their prosthesis falling off or slipping.

Provides children with cancer with a ball cap autographed by their favorite athlete, actor, singer, or other notable person of their choice.

Offers one Magic Yarn wig free to the family of any child experiencing medical hair loss.
